





All riders are required to wear an approved safety helmet with harness when mounted. All Dressage classes for Level 1/First Level and above will be held in the large arena. A horse/rider combo may only enter two consecutive levels and horse a total of 4 tests in show. Every effort will be made to accommodate scheduling requests. First Place prizes and ribbons awarded to 4 places. Junior classes with 4 or more entries will be divided 12 & under and 13 – 18. Entry fees: \$30 per test for Ride-a-Test, \$20 per test for western and traditional dressage except: \$10 per rider for Pas de Deux and \$5 per rider for Quadrille. Entry fees are non refundable after the closing date unless request for refund is accompanied by vet/doctor excuse. Late entries will be accepted if schedule allows. No office fee – no non-member fee! Jump out \$5/day, day stall \$25, overnight stall \$35, weekend stall \$45, stalls include 1 bag of bedding, plenty of parking.

Demystifying the Rule Books

Installment One – Rider Requirements – What is my status?

I am by no means an expert when it comes to the hundreds of pages of rules that comprise the USEF rules around dressage utilized by the USEF, USDF, WDAA and IaDCTA. But over the next few months I plan to write a series of articles to assist in demystifying some of the more commonly needed information for the local competitor based on questions that have come to me from both students and fellow competitors.

The 2015 rule books are readily accessible for all to view at the following:

Please keep in mind that the rule book is an evergreen document so you have to be cognizant of ongoing rule changes.

This month's topic is from the General Rules. How do you know if you are an Open Rider, a Junior Rider, a Young Rider or an Adult Amateur Rider? We find the answer in GR 13 – Competition Participants and Associated Individuals, subchapter 13-B, GR1306 and 1307.

Regardless of one's equestrian skills and/or accomplishments, a person is an amateur if after his 18th birthday he has not engaged in any of the activities identified in the bullets below. In the Dressage Division, individuals are only eligible to compete as amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. Youth are riders 21 years of age or less. A junior is a rider under the age of 18 and a young rider is 18 thru 21 years of age. You must be an active USEF member to obtain amateur status for rated competition and hold an amateur card.

The simplest explanation for determining if you are an amateur or an open (professional) rider is to ask yourself if you receive monetary compensation of any amount specifically related to providing services including teaching lessons (riding or driving), exercising horses, showing horses, training horses, assisting in training horses, schooling horses, conducting a seminar or clinic or acting as a consultant in any of the previously listed activities. Non-monetary gifts with values over \$300 annually are considered compensation to a professional. In addition if you are an employee performing any of the previously listed activities even if you are employed by a family member you are considered a professional. Also if you advertise yourself in any way (this includes on social media) to provide any of the above services you must compete in the open division. The following are excerpts from the rule book.

The following activities are permitted to be done by amateurs:

- Accept reimbursement for actual expenses associated with conducting classroom seminars for a not-for-profit organization, therapeutic riding programs, or programs for charitable organizations approved in advance by the Federation.
- Act as a camp counselor when not hired in the exclusive capacity as a riding instructor; assist in setting schooling fences without remuneration; give instruction or training to handicapped riders for therapeutic purposes.
- Appear in advertisements and/or articles related to acknowledgement of one's own personal or business sponsorship of a competition and/or awards earned by one's owned horses.
- Accept prize money as the owner of a horse in any class other than equitation or showmanship classes.
- Accept prize money in Dressage.
- Accept a non-monetary token gift of appreciation valued less than \$300 annually.
- Serve as an intern for college credit or course requirements at an accredited institution provided one has never held professional status with the Federation or any other equestrian National Federation. In addition, one may accept reimbursement for expenses without profit, as prescribed by the educational institution's program, for the internship. At the request of the Federation, an Amateur shall provide certification from the accredited educational institution under whose auspices a student is pursuing an internship that he is undertaking the internship to meet course or degree requirements.
- Write books or articles related to horses.
- Accept remuneration for providing service in one's capacity as a: presenter or panelist at a Federation licensed officials' clinic, competition manager, competition secretary, judge, steward, technical delegate, course designer, announcer, TV commentator, veterinarian, groom, farrier, tack shop operator, breeder, or boarder, or horse transporter.
- Accept reimbursement for any bona fide expenses directly related to the horse (i.e. farrier/vet bills, entries). Travel, hotel, equipment, and room and board are not considered bona fide expenses.
- Accept educational competition or training grant(s).

Unless expressly permitted above, a person is a professional if after his 18th birthday he does any of the following:

- Accepts remuneration AND rides, exercises, drives, shows, trains, assists in training, schools or conducts clinics or seminars.
- Accepts remuneration AND gives riding or driving lessons, showmanship lessons, equitation lessons, trains horses, or provides consultation services in riding, driving, showmanship, equitation, or training of horses.
- Accepts remuneration AND acts as an employee in a position such as a groom, farrier, bookkeeper, veterinarian or barn manager AND instructs, rides, drives, shows, trains or schools horses that are owned, boarded or trained by his employer, any member of his employer's family, or a business in which his employer has an ownership interest.

- Accepts remuneration AND uses his name, photograph or other form of personal association as a horseperson in connection with any advertisement or product/ service for sale, including but not limited to apparel, equipment or property.
- Accepts prize money unless permitted in paragraph 3d or 3e above.
- Rides, drives or shows any horse that a cohabitant or family member or a cohabitant or family member's business receives remuneration for boarding, training, riding, driving or showing. A cohabitant or family member of a trainer may not absolve themselves of this rule by entering into a lease or any other agreement for a horse owned by a client of the trainer.
- Gives instruction to any person or rides, drives, or shows any horse, for which activity his cohabitant or another person in his family or business in which his cohabitant or a family member controls will receive remuneration for the activity. A cohabitant or family member of a trainer may not absolve themselves of this rule by entering into a lease or any other agreement for a horse owned by a client of the trainer.
- Accepts remuneration AND acts as an agent in the sale of a horse or pony or accepts a horse or pony on consignment for the purpose of sale or training that is not owned by him, his cohabitant, or a member of his family, a farm/ranch/syndicate/ partnership/corporation/business in which he, his cohabitant or a member of his family controls.
- Advertises one's equestrian services such as training or instruction.
- Accepts remuneration AND acts as an intern, apprentice, or working student whose responsibilities include, but are not limited to, riding, driving, showmanship, handling, showing, training or assisting in training, giving lessons/coaching and/or schooling horses other than horses actually owned by him.
- Accepts remuneration in excess of rental fee for use of a facility, ring or school horses.
- Accepts remuneration for such use AND uses commercial logoed items while on competition grounds unless expressly permitted by applicable division rules.

It is simple to change your status from amateur to professional with the USEF – simply complete that online on the USEF website or download a form to complete and send snail mail. It is far more complicated to regain your amateur status. First you must cease professional activities for an entire year. Then provide a notarized letter signed by your self specifying the dates and activities that have been performed since ceasing pro activities. Then provide at least two notarized letters from SR Active USEF members stating their relationship to you as well as outlining your prior year's activities and testifying you did not engage in pro activities. Then pay a \$50 processing fee. And finally sign and declare amateur status on a current USEF membership application. After all the above a hearing committee will review your request and determine if it can be approved. All changes from amateur to pro and from pro to amateur are published on the USEF website.

That is about it in a nut shell...well maybe in a bread box. It is not simple. As for the IaDCTA the club expectation is you will follow the guidelines above around your status. For local shows there is not an expectation you will provide an amateur card but that you will enter appropriately based on your actual status. Stay tuned next month for installment two: Equipment Excerpts – Is my Bit Legal for traditional and/or western dressage?


