### Demystifying the Rule Books

### Installment Two - Equipment Excerpts - Is my equipment legal?

I must reiterate that I am by no means an expert when it comes to the hundreds of pages of rules that comprise the USEF rules around dressage utilized by the USEF, USDF, WDAA and IaDCTA. That being said this is the second in a series of articles to assist in demystifying some of the more commonly needed information for the local competitor based on questions that have come to me from both students and fellow competitors.



Please keep in mind that the rule book is an ever changing document so you have to be cognizant of ongoing rule changes.

This month's topic is from USEF DR 120 & 121 and USEF WD 120, 121 & 122 and will specifically reference how to determine if the bit in your horse's mouth or bridle on its head or spurs on your boots or whip you carry will get you eliminated if/when you are selected to be the rider exiting a class that has their equipment inspected. At a USEF/USDF competition the current requirement is that 1/3 of the competitors in a class have their equipment inspected. The WDAA competitions are more stringent requiring 100% of all entries to be inspected upon exiting the arena after their test.

Snaffle bits at a traditional dressage show are required at tests for second level and under. Permitted single snaffles include single or double jointed, mullen mouth, French link and some single center rollers are also allowed (single snaffle pictures can be found in DR 121 A). Snaffles must be smooth and solid so not twisted, wire or with multiple rollers. Rubber, plastic and other synthetic bits are allowed but no latex may be added. The diameter of the mouthpiece must be a minimum of 10 mm diameter at the rings or cheeks. Curvature is allowed for tongue relief but can be no more than 30 mm deviation. The following drawing is an illustration from the USEF DR 121 rules regarding the deviation:



At third level and higher a double bridle where both a snaffle and a curb are used is optional. There are some instances such as USEF High Performance where a double bridle is required (please refer to DR 121.4 for details). The types of "bradoon" snaffle mouthpieces is similar to single snaffles and for horses above second level competing in single snaffles there is also much similarity to those for horses at and below. The diameter of the bradoon is also limited to 10 mm however snaffles used in Young horse classes have to be 14 mm. The diameter of the curb must be 12 mm at the cheeks. The lever arm of the curb bit cannot exceed 10 cm below the mouth piece and the upper cheek must be shorter than the lower cheek. Curb chain hooks can be fixed or not fixed. Curb chain lays flat and may have a leather or rubber cover. More information including pictures can be found in DR 121 B.

In addition to the bit requirements there are also noseband and bridle requirements. With a single snaffle a dropped, cavesson, flash, figure 8 and combined (no throatlatch) nosebands are allowed. With a double only a cavesson or a combined are allowed and the lower strap (flash) on the combined must be removed. A Micklem Bridle is also permitted with single snaffles.

Anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds at a USEF/USDF competition must wear protective headgear. One whip no longer than 47.2 inches (120 cm) including the lash may be carried during all competitions except in regional, national and high performance championships and at high performance qualifying and selection trials. The only exception is competitors riding side saddle at regionals. FEI pony riders are limited to 100 cm in length. Adjustable-length whips are not allowed when mounted. Spurs must be made of metal and of English-style. Spur shanks must be curved or pointing straight back and if curved the shank must be directed down. Rowels are allowed but must be blunt/smooth and free to rotate. The maximum shank length including rowels is 2" (5.08 cm) except FEI pony riders can only use blunt spurs up to 3.5 cm. Spur restrictions also apply to the warm up areas.

Western Dressage has its own equipment rules so it is not a good idea to assume that your bit is interchangeable between WDAA and USEF/USDF competitions. Simple snaffles of O ring, Egg Butt or D ring are allowed with ring diameters between 2" (50.8 mm) minimum and 4" (101.6 mm) maximum. Rings are not allowed to be slotted or have attachments that would provide leverage. The mouthpiece must be round, oval or egg shape and smooth having two or three pieces. Latex wrap is permitted. One inch (25 mm) from the cheek the diameter must be at least 5/16" (7.9 mm) up to 3/4" (19.05 mm) with

a gradual decrease from the cheek to the center. With three piece mouthpieces the connecting ring length may not exceed 1 1/4" (31.75 mm) or if a flat bar may not exceed 2" (50.8 mm) long and width must be between 3/8" (9.5 mm) and 3/4" (19.05 mm) and must lay flat in the horse's mouth. A mullen mouth, barrel mouth, full cheeks as well as rubber or plastic snaffles are also permitted. No flat, sharp, twisted or pointed edges of any kind are allowed on the mouthpiece. A bit hobble may be used on a ring snaffle if attached below the reins. When riding in a snaffle the rider must use two hands on the reins.


Hackamores are permitted at all levels on horses of any age. The bosal must be round in shape and made of braided rawhide or leather and have a flexible non-metallic core. No other material of any kind is to be used in conjunction with the bosal however they may be wrapped with smooth electrical tape to prevent rubbing. Mechanical hackamores are not permitted. Western style bitless bridles are allowed when made of leather or leather like materials. The western two rein bridle is permitted.

There is no discrimination against any standard western curb bit (bit with leverage). It may or may not have shanks with maximum shank length being 8 1/2" (21.59 cm). Shanks may be loose or fixed and a bit with slots for attaching on the headstall or reins is allowed. A curb chain or flat leather chin strap is required and they must be at least 1/2" wide and lay flat against the jaw. No wire, rawhide, metal or round, rolled, braided chains or straps are allowed. The bars of the mouthpiece must be round and smooth with inlays allowed if smooth and latex wrap also allowed. Measured 1" (25 mm) from the cheek the mouthpiece diameter must be between 5/16" (7.9 mm) and 3/4" (19.05 mm). The mouthpiece may be two or three pieces. The third piece has the same size restrictions as a snaffle. The port must be no higher than 3 1/2" (8.89 cm) and rollers in the center as well as covers are acceptable. Broken mouthpieces, half breeds and spades are allowed and spades are permitted to have wire on the braces.

Reins must be attached to each shank and split, romal, rein chains (spade), mecate or loop reins are allowed. With a curb the rider can use one or two hands with split, connected or mecate type reins. Romal reins must be used with only one hand on the reins and the other hand on the popper with at least 16" of rein between the hands. When using one hand on the reins the rider is allowed to momentarily use the free had to adjust the rein length for example after the free walk. Any western type headstall must be used. A western cavesson is permitted. Native and national bridles are allowed. Snaffles and bosals are encouraged for horses 5 and under.

A western dressage rider can carry one whip no longer than 47.2" (120 cm) including the lash in western dressage classes. A suitable western hat is required however approved protective headgear of any style is acceptable. Spurs are allowed and may be of English or Western type. Protective manufactured leg wraps are also permitted and should match the natural color of the horse as much as possible. However boots (including "easy-boots") or tail bandages are not allowed Also prohibited are martingales, bit guards and other types of gadgets (such as bearing, side, running and balancing reins, nasal strips, tongue ties, blinkers, ear plugs, etc). Further details on permitted and prohibited equipment for western dressage can be found in WD 120 thru 122.

That's it for now and again obviously not simple. At IaDCTA schooling shows the expectation is you will follow the rules. At some local shows you may have your equipment inspected. At all rated shows you are subject to inspection by the TD or a designee. Be prepared. Read the rules (all the links are above) because you are expected to follow them! Looking ahead to the next installment where we will look at interesting bits and pieces from the rules and some differences and similarities between traditional and western dressage. Until next time – ride right!

### Adult Day Camp presented by

### Iowa Dressage and Combined Training Association, IaDCTA

Remember the days of temperatures below freezing, wind chills, snow and ice? It seems so long ago, yet it's only been a couple of months since we've been blessed with improving weather and much higher quality riding time. The Iowa Dressage and Combined Training Association, IaDCTA, provided its members and potential members with the opportunity to get their riding season kicked into gear early this spring with the Adult Day Camp at the Kirkwood Equestrian Center in March. It was the first year for this type of event and I was fortunate enough to be able to take advantage of several of the sessions offered.

The main draw for me was an opportunity to take dressage lessons with Matt McLaughlin. IaDCTA had been working on providing another opportunity for its members to ride with him after the excellent feedback from the clinic they sponsored last year in Des Moines. I had finally found my new equine partner, a mare named Leah (pronounced like the princess in Star Wars), last fall and had been looking forward to starting our training together in earnest. I've spent time over the winter trying to connect and develop our new partnership, but I still had some deep-seated fears and trust issues from a traumatic fall 18 months before on a different horse. Matt helped me work on the foundations of riding... rhythm and relaxation... in order to connect with Leah better through my seat and Feel the movement and timing necessary to ride effectively. By the end of my second ride on Sunday I was thrilled to experience a few moments of "dancing" with Leah as we were doing leg yields with consistent connection, roundness, throughness and the most subtle aids I've ever managed in order to effect change and harmony. Needless to say, I was ecstatic!

Another draw to the Adult Day Camp for me was the Bomb Proof Your Horse clinic orchestrated by Larry Bradley and his family. Leah was still a little spooky sometimes and even though her spooks are small, they tended to unnerve me. My fear would resurface unwarranted and I'd hold my breath in anticipation of the unexpected violent buck that launched me into the air and off to the ER 18 months earlier. I didn't realize until participating in the despooking clinic how much trust played into our partnership. We had to learn to trust each other, it was not just about Leah trusting me. The clinic included tarps they kept increasing in size, color, shape and complexity to cross over. There were noisy plastic bottles, bags, floating balloons, toys and moving objects on the ground to walk on and through. There was a large doorway of hanging strips of material like walking through a "car wash." There was also a giant ball in the center that some horses enjoyed pushing around with their noses. (This was not Leah's thing, but she pushed the ball when I asked her to nevertheless.) Lastly, there were the scary soft mattresses that kept getting bigger, longer and deeper as we walked by. I hate to admit it, but it became abundantly clear that I was the one afraid to walk over the mattresses while mounted and Leah was totally nonplussed! Larry and his crew were able to guide me over and help my confidence in Leah so that I trusted she would take care of us and she did! The 2 hour session on despooking gave me the faith, confidence and trust in my mare that has continued to affect our partnership today! We had a fabulous first trail ride just a couple weeks ago with a multitude of potentially scary encounters that were non-events. I relied on the skills I learned in the clinic to provide a calm, safe, trustworthy partner my horse could count on during the adventure and Leah far exceeded my hopes and expectations.

I would have been satisfied if the clinic offerings had ended there, but it was an Adult Day Camp with several more events to take advantage of. During the 3 day weekend, I attended several sessions that were geared toward preparing for the upcoming riding season:

- "Balance Your Body" with chiropractor Dr. Laura Ledger provided insights into our actually body/spinal alignment while off the horse and how it may affect us and our horse while riding. She provided some exercises to help us build our core strength ( "dead bug" and "bridge") and enable improvement in maintaining better alignment as well.
- Lavonne Smith is a holistic health coach that provided information on Nutrition and the importance of feeding the needs of our body, such as hydration, not just our cravings. Often this takes forethought and a little planning, but ultimately helps with developing better overall habits to take care of ourselves as well as our horses. The May newsletter of The Collection has copies of the handouts she provided titled "Not Just Along for the Ride... are you making healthy decisions?"
- Learn How to Enter a Show was another offering. Unfortunately, I had to get the cliff-notes
  version instead because I couldn't participate in two sessions at the same time. (My only
  complaint about the entire event is that I couldn't participate in everything because I couldn't
  be in two places at once!) PJ Koehler provided some terrific information and sample entry
  forms for completing the information correctly. There can be significant costs and missed
  opportunities at the recognized level if the required forms are incomplete or incorrect.
- Massage with Valerie Baack. This one was as wonderful as it sounds! I scheduled my chair massage session after my first clinic ride and boy did she work the kinks out! It was more of a therapeutic sports massage and definitely helped me to be able to perform for my second ride on Sunday. Such a lifesaver!!
- Get Fit with Judy Lubben was a great way to "break-in" our new yoga mats from IaDCTA. Judy and her husband, Tom, provided guidance and sample exercises for everything from Yoga and stretching to Pilates and strength training.
- Saddle Fitting with Trilogy Saddle Fitter Megan Drischler. I just had my saddle fitted a year
  ago, but realized after getting to the show that the horse I'd been riding at the time had a
  completely different conformation than my new mare. Megan evaluated my current saddle
  both off and on the horse. She pulled the old flocking material restuffed with new wool to
  allow room for my mare's back to come up and provide softer level panels resting on her
  back. The birds in the practice ring loved the old material for their spring nests and Leah
  moved significantly better in my next lesson with the improved saddle fit.
- Biomechanics Evaluation by Lissa. Lissa gave a short presentation on what this involves, how it impacts humans on the ground, horses on the ground and the partnership once we're mounted. She provided insights on improving both parts of the equation and how her detailed evaluations and recommendations can help with our overall performance.

Along with all the above sessions, opportunities and information we had plenty of entertainment with tasty meals, cheesecakes, wine tasting from the 14 Hands wine selections and chocolate. Ask the club about the cool training pyramid bracelets they provided, yoga mats and the awesome customized dressage jackets you can still order through them (order form is on the IaDCTA web site.)

The Adult Day Camp was the perfect opportunity to kick off this riding season's preparations. From getting my trailer ready, practice loading and unloading, thinking about ways to improve my health and my horses health, bathing 5+ months of mud and muck off to unveil the grey horse I thought I had, to connecting with other equestrians and reconnecting with IaDCTA members and the terrific support network they provide. A huge Thank You goes out to Tammy and the IaDCTA club for putting on a timely and well-planned event for everyone! I'd love to do this again next year!
