MEETING MINUTES

The monthly board meeting of the Iowa Dressage and Combined Training Association was held via conference call on July 14, 2015 and called to order at 7:10 p.m.

Board members present were Tammy Lisi, Danielle Baker, Nena Denman, Barb Zukowski, PJ Koehler, Sharon Malmberg, and Katie Barrowcliff.

Those not present were Michelle Corwin and Chris Gutierrez.

Other member present was Derith Vogt.

Motion to approve the meeting's agenda was made by Sharon and seconded by Danielle.

Motion to approve the June treasurer's report was made by PJ and seconded by Barb.

The 2015 Iowa Classics I & II was discussed. Complaints communicated to the board were old manure in the stalls upon arrival and riders not getting their scores in time in accordance with the Level 3 requirements. Other complaints received were the PA system not working correctly for the musical freestyles and that there were very few IaDCTA members as riders.

Consideration was held as to whether or not the club should continue to hold the Classics as a Level 3 competition at MLEC. Ideas have been suggested to move down to a Level 2 competition or to find a different venue. A decision was made to survey members and find out what they would like to do.

The Championship Schooling Show series was reviewed. The entry form and show bill are being worked on. A contract has been sent to a judge for both days.

There are still openings for the Dolly Hannon clinic in September at Belinda's Little Horse House. Entries can be sent to Chris.

A change in volunteer requirements for end of year awards was deliberated. PJ made a motion with Barb seconding to increase volunteers hours to 8 with a minimum of 4 hours from an IaDCTA managed event with rest from an IaDCTA recognized event. The motion also included the removal of recruiting new members as one of the requirements.

Since the club is having a hard time finding someone to keep the website up to date, Chris had mentioned talking to Club Express to see if they would be able to do it.

Motion to adjourn was made by Danielle and seconded by Sharon.

Meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.

The next meeting will be August 11, 2015. Location to be determined.



Demystifying the Rule Books

Installment Three – Similaities and Differences between Western and English Dressage

By now the reader must be tired of my reiteration that I am by no means an expert when it comes to the hundreds of pages of rules that comprise the USEF rules around dressage utilized by the USEF, USDF, WDAA and IaDCTA. Still the writing of a series of articles to assist in demystifying some of the more commonly needed information for the local competitor seems an appropriate path in helping IaDCTA members, students and fellow competitors with better understanding expectations in the competition arena.

Again remember to keep in mind that the rule books are ever changing documents so you have to be cognizant of ongoing rule changes.

This month's topic discussing some similarities and differences between Western and English dressage comes from throughout the rule books and will be tagged for location in the rule books within the paragraphs that follow.

In installment two a comment was made that where bits are concerned not to assume a bit that is acceptable in the traditional dressage arena is acceptable in the western dressage arena. The opposite also applies. Because of the inherent differences between Western and English disciplines there is not complete overlap in bits that are permitted (WD 120 & 121 and DR 121). For example in English dressage a snaffle is always a snaffle but in Western dressage the addition of a bit hobble (curb strap) may change the bit from a snaffle to a "curb" because of the added leverage this strap creates. In English dressage this is not allowed and the only time a curb chain is used in on the curb bit of a double bridle. And dependent on the presence of the bit hobble on the snaffle bit one must take care in Western dressage to follow the appropriate rules for types of reins and use of one or two hands on the reins. In English dressage a "Baucher" is permitted – this bit has a separate ring to attach it to the bridle which by its engineering will create a small amount of leverage. However this bit is not permitted to

be used as a snaffle in Western dressage.

Another interesting difference is how the use of voice is viewed (WD 118 and DR 117). In English dressage it is not permitted and for each occurrence the judge is permitted to reduce the mark in the box by at least 2 and may have the scribe mark "voice" on the test sheet in red. In Western dressage use of the voice is considered an additional aid and quiet use of voice as well as clicking of the tongue is permitted. The whip however is a similarity not a difference (DR 121.10 and WD 120.4). Both rule books state that one whip 47.2 inches (120 centimeters) is allowed. Regarding spurs (DR 120.10 and WD 122.2c) the western rules simply state spurs of Western style or English dressage style are allowed. The Western style may be with or without blunt tines. The English dressage rules are more detailed specifying spurs to be made of metal and that only English style spurs are permitted. Additional specifications include that straight shanks must point directly back from the center of the spur and curved shanks must be worn with the shank in a downward direction but that swan necked spurs are allowed. The inside arm of spurs must be smooth and rubber covers are permitted. If rowels are present they need to be blunt or smooth as well as free to rotate. Including rowels the maximum length a spur can be is 2 inches (5.08 centimeters). Further details exist around certain classes, ponies and riders with dispensations.

There are also differences around how many classes can be ridden in a day (DR119 and WD 102). For English dressage at Third Level and below three tests per day are allowed including the Rider Tests but at Fourth Level and above only two tests per day are allowed. Dressage Seat Equitation, Quadrille, Pas de Deux and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day. Maximum number of rides is per horse so if a horse is ridden by more than one rider the horse has to meet the restrictions not the rider. For Western dressage there is no limit on the number of rides in a day and a horse may be ridden by multiple riders. However shows may set limitations on the show bill so be sure to check that out prior to entering.

The gaits in Western (WD 103 – 105) and English (DR 103 – 105) dressage have both similarities and differences. A clear 4 beat walk is designated with both rule books calling out the requirements of a marching gait with regularity and equal intervals between each beat. Lateral walks and irregularity in the walk are considered defects by both disciplines. Western dressage recognizes three walks – the collected, the working and the free walk. English dressage recognizes four walks – the medium, the collected, the extended and the free walk. The jog (Western) and the trot (English) also have similarities and differences. Both rule books call out a 2 beat gait of alternating diagonal pairs of legs showing free, active and regular steps. The jog and the trot both are required to have regular and elastic steps as well as cadence and impulsion in extension and the ability to maintain the same rhythm and natural balance with in the different paces of the gait. Western dressage recognizes four jogs – the collected, the working, the lengthening of strides and the free jog. English dressage recognizes five trots – the working, the lengthening of steps, the collected, the medium and the extended trot.

The lope and canter perhaps have greater distinction between Western and English.

While both rule books require a regular 3 beat gait with a moment of suspension after the third beat there is less similarity after that. The lope generally has a slower tempo than a canter and care needs to be taken not to lose the rhythm or regularity and to avoid excessive slowness or speed. It needs to show balance, rhythm, straightness, suppleness, self-carriage and engagement. There are four lopes – the collected, the working, the lengthening of strides and the counter lope. The canter should be moved into without hesitation and remain light, cadenced, regular, uphill, engaged and balanced. When moving on straight lines the horse should be straight and on curved lines the horse should bend correctly on the curve. There are five canters – the working, the lengthening of strides, the collected, the medium and the extended canter.

A final statement about gait differences – there is no allowance in the English dressage for horses that have gaits outside the standard walk, trot and canter. Horses that are "gaited" are not permitted at all. However in Western dressage there is a separate set of gait rules for "gaited" horses. Should the reader be interested that information is found in WD 106.

Last but not least is a moment to address the resistance to Western dressage. Agreed is that Western dressage is not dressage in the traditional sense. However the need for a more complete and humane path of training for western horses cannot be denied. To me the comparison of the goal statement of Western dressage and the object statement of English dressage shows most clearly the question of "why western". USEF DR 101.1 states "The object of dressage is the development of the horse into a happy athlete through harmonious education. As a result, it makes the horse calm, supple, loose and flexible but also confident, attentive and keen, thus achieving perfect understanding with the rider". USEF WD 101.1 states "The goal of Western Dressage is to develop a partnership between a happy equine athlete working in harmony with his rider. A system of progressive training produces a horse that is physically strong, balanced, supple and flexible; this equine athlete also demonstrates a calm, confident, attentive attitude and is happy to do his job".

Enough said! As always be prepared. Read the rules (all the links are above) because you are expected to follow them! Looking ahead to the next installment where we will look at fashion and turn out for both dressage disciplines. Until next time – ride right!

2015 IaDCTA Awards

The IaDCTA Awards program is designed to recognize achievement of those riders who consistently earn good scores and advance their riding level, and encourages a high standard of horsemanship in Dressage, Combined Training, and Western Dressage at IaDCTA-approved shows.

Guidelines for All Awards

 Only Scores from IaDCTA Recognized Dressage, Combined Training, and Western Dressage Shows will be counted towards IaDCTA Awards.

- 2. Rider of the horse must be an IaDCTA member at the time qualifying scores are earned.
- 3. Each Horse must be registered at the time qualifying scores are earned.
- A Rider may only qualify to win at two consecutive levels on the same horse, but Riders may qualify as many Horses as they wish.

5. If Riders share a Horse, the Horse will be limited to four rides per day at two consecutive levels, and only one Horse and Rider combination per level or class.

- A protective ASTM approved hard hat with chin harness must be worn when mounted regardless of rider's age or level of competency.
- A Rider is not allowed to enter more than 1 division. (i.e., cannot enter Open and AA.) Definitions of Rider Divisions:

A. Adult Amateur (AA): for Dressage, competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22 (USEF rules GR101).

- B. Open division is for professionals as described by USEF rules GR1306.
- C. Young Riders (JR/YR) are 21 and under.
- D. Junior 14 (JR14) are 14 years and under.
- E. Vintage (VIN) are 50 years and over.

8. Dressage and Western Dressage Competitors must obtain at three scores of 58.000% or greater from at least two different Judges to count towards IaDCTA Awards. Combined Training Results will be submitted as a placing for the class and awarded points towards a minimum point total to qualify for IaDCTA Awards.

Complete one type of service per Rider. Volunteer hours can only be earned by IaDCTA members, and gifted to other IaDCTA members.

- A. Complete 7 hours of volunteer time at IaDCTA Recognized events.

 The IaDCTA Show Series Year runs from January 1st to October 31st. (2014 Championship Schooling Show results counts towards 2015 awards.)

 Championship rides (IaDCTA, Regional, or other Championships) do not count towards IaDCTA Awards.
