The monthly board meeting of the Iowa Dressage and Combined Training Association was called to order at 6:50 p.m. on November 2, 2015.

Members attending the meeting were: Sharon Malmberg, Tammy Lisi, Danielle Baker, Nena Denman, Chris Gutierrez, Barb Zukowski, PJ Koehler, and Katie Barrowcliff.

Member not attending was Michelle Corwin.

Motion was made by Chris and seconded by Barb to approve the meeting minutes from September.

Motion made by Barb and seconded by Sharon to approve the treasurer's reports from August and September.

Sharon reported on the membership committee. The club is up approximately 15 members from last year.

The year-end awards banquet will be January 10, 2016 at the West Des Moines Country Club. Nena moved the club raise the price of the meal to \$30 due to the country club's rates increasing. Danielle seconded. Sharon is working on membership forms to make membership renewals easier at the banquet. PJ and Danielle are in charge of obtaining items for the silent auction.

After many months of considering, it was decided to cancel the 2016 Classics. This is due the high expense of managing the show as well as the lack of member participation. Motion was made by Danielle and seconded by Chris that the club take a 1 year hiatus from the Classics. The motion included paying the \$100 fee to USEF to cancel the show for 2016. This will make the club inactive for 2016 but will allow us to retain the June dates for 2017.

An option was discussed to share a weekend show in the spring with the Iowa Arabian Horse Association. There would be an open schooling show the first part of the weekend with a rated Arabian show at the end.

The 2015 Championships was discussed. The eventing championships were moved to the same weekend resulting in the extremely low attendance. Many positive comments were made about Ellsworth Equestrian Center and their staff. They were very nice and helpful, and the facility itself was clean and had good footing. It was decided to have Chris contact them to get a contract for the 2016 Championship show.

A motion was made by Barb and seconded by Danielle to raise the recognition fees in the 2016. These fees will be \$75 for USDF/USEF recognized shows and \$45 for schooling shows. These are for shows that are NOT managed by IaDCTA and must be paid prior to the show or it will not be recognized by the club for awards. Motion passed with 5 members approving and 1 opposing.

A \$300 check was sent to Dolly Hannon for cancelling her clinic in September. She is being rescheduled for a weekend in April. Emery Training Center will be hosting the clinic.

A few members have shown interest in running for the board next year. Anyone else interested should contact Danielle or PJ.

The club trailer will need rewired and the tires checked. PJ volunteered to take the trailer in and get an estimate for the work.

Barb is the proxy for the USDF Convention. PJ moved and Danielle seconded the give her a \$300 stipend for expenses. A GMO basket will also be put together from the club for a fundraiser at the Convention.

Danielle moved and Sharon seconded to adjourn the meeting.

How your saddle sits on your horse influences how you sit in your saddle. Once you become aware of this relatively simple fact, you'll never not notice it again. But I see people riding in improperly balanced saddles all the time, and they are usually struggling to maintain their own position and balance, which of course makes it very hard for them to ride their horse effectively... it's basically a downward spiral.

So what can you do easily, daily even, to double check your balance? Post the trot stand-stand-sit-stand-stand-sit and see if you can get into a rhythm. As an exercise, it's challenging enough on its own, but it's the feedback it gives you that is the real benefit of the exercise. It doesn't matter so much whether or not you can do it, but the bigger more important part is what goes wrong if you can't do it. Things that can happen:

1) You easily stand-stand-sit-stand-sit around the arena, in a position you are pleased to call a regular working position. Awesome!!
You are balanced, and your saddle is more than likely supporting you in a balanced position. Carry on with your lovely riding!

A student of mine showing excellent balance at the top of the rise. Her balance is independent of her reins. She looks like she's standing on the ground with her knees bent, shoulders and hips directly over her leg, so she doesn't need to lean forward to balance herself.

2) You stand-stand and fall backwards, either to splat in the saddle or to catch yourself on the reins, making for a very awkward or heavy-sit-beat and then a near impossible return to continue with the next-stand-stand. This means you are behind the motion, and this is the most common thing that happens. To trouble shoot this one, first make your reins as long/loose as you safely can. You are going to lose your balance, and that's ok, but let's not make your horse's mouth bear the brunt of it!

First off, try to hold a two-point position (standing in your stirrups, upper body inclined slightly forward, hips back, heels down, shoulders and eyes up). Once you've found balance there, wrap your calves a little more snug around your horse and try posting stand-stand-sit-stand-stand-sit keeping your upper body more forward than you usually would, and landing very lightly on the sit part, barely touching the saddle at all. Then slowly straighten up as you're posting, continuing to barely touch the saddle on the sit beat, until whatever point you fall backwards. You might find after a few repetitions that you find your balance and you're all set, in that case use this as an exercise repeated often until it's easy to help you maintain a more balanced position and strengthen your lower leg.

If you find it relatively easy in a leaning-forward position, but impossible to straighten up, then there is a good chance your stirrups (and thus legs) are too far in front of your center of gravity. In this case, assuming your saddle fits you, there is a very good chance the front of your saddle is sitting too high, making your seat end up too far back in the saddle, putting you in a chair seat. Try adding some extra padding under the back of the saddle, if that solves the problem then you know you have a saddle balance problem and need to figure out if you need a new saddle, a reflock, or just a shim under the back... you might need to consult a saddle fitter if you aren't sure.

3) You attempt to stand-stand and topple forward, catching yourself on your horse's neck with your arms. Usually at the same time your lower leg has swung backwards, your heel has come up, and often your foot as slipped through the stirrup leaving it back by your heel. These riders also often pinch with their knees because they lack stability in the lower leg.

Break the exercise down by first going into a two-point position, telling yourself to push down-forward with your heels and backwards with your hips. This will help you balance over your leg. Start to do mini-posts in this exaggerated position, slowly straightening up. A small position tweak and a little more effort to keep your lower leg long and stable under you might be all you needed, and the exercise will quickly become easier.

If you still find it impossible to release the grip of your knee (which lets you keep your hip back behind your leg) and balance as you straighten up, then this could be an indication your saddle is sitting low in front, causing the deepest part of the seat where your seat bones end up to be too far over or even in front of where your leg hangs. To test this, add some extra padding under the front of your saddle, and repeat the process. If this improves your balance, then you need to figure out how to properly fit your saddle so that it sits higher in front and properly balanced on your horse's back. It might just need a riser pad, extra flocking added, or you might need a narrower tree.

If a little extra padding under the front or back of the saddle doesn't help your balance, then you probably have a problem that goes beyond a small balance adjustment. Your saddle might be too big or too small for you, the blocks might not fit you right, the stirrup bar might be in a bad position for your leg, or the saddle could be a poorly balanced design. Try the same exercise in a few other saddles, or have another rider try it in yours to get a better idea what might be going on.

BONUS: What usually happens once the rider figures out how to carry herself smoothly doing stand-stand-sit repeatedly without hanging on the reins or landing hard on the saddle is the horse's back starts to come up and the head starts to stretch down. Did that happen for you?

2015 IaDCTA Awards

The IaDCTA Awards program is designed to recognize achievement of those riders who consistently earn good scores and advance their riding level, and encourages a high standard of horsemanship in Dressage, Combined Training, and Western Dressage at IaDCTA-approved shows.

Guidelines for All Awards

- Only Scores from IaDCTA Recognized Dressage, Combined Training, and Western Dressage Shows will be counted towards IaDCTA Awards.
- 2. Rider of the horse must be an IaDCTA member at the time qualifying scores are earned.
- 3. Each Horse must be registered at the time qualifying scores are earned.
- A Rider may only qualify to win at two consecutive levels on the same horse, but Riders may qualify as many Horses as they wish.
- If Riders share a Horse, the Horse will be limited to four rides per day at two consecutive levels, and only one Horse and Rider combination per level or class.
- A protective ASTM approved hard hat with chin harness must be worn when mounted regardless of rider's age or level of competency.
- 7. A Rider is not allowed to enter more than 1 division. (i.e., cannot enter Open and AA.) Definitions of Rider Divisions:
 - A. Adult Amateur (AA): for Dressage, competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22 (USEF rules GR101).
 - B. Open division is for professionals as described by USEF rules GR1306.
 - C. Young Riders (JR/YR) are 21 and under.
 - D. Junior 14 (JR14) are 14 years and under.
 - E. Vintage (VIN) are 50 years and over.
- 8. Dressage and Western Dressage Competitors must obtain at three scores of 58.000% or greater from at least two different Judges to count towards IaDCTA Awards. Combined Training Results will be submitted as a placing for the class and awarded points towards a minimum point total to qualify for IaDCTA Awards.
- Complete one type of service per Rider. Volunteer hours can only be earned by laDCTA members, and gifted to other laDCTA members.
 - A. Complete 7 hours of volunteer time at laDCTA Recognized events.
 - Recruit 4 new members to IaDCTA.
 - C. Donate \$200.00 cash to IaDCTA.
- The IaDCTA Show Series Year runs from January 1st to October 31st. (2014 Championship Schooling Show results counts towards 2015 awards.)
- Championship rides (IaDCTA, Regional, or other Championships) do not count towards
 IaDCTA Awards.

IaDCTA Awards

- IaDCTA Championship Show: The final show of the IaDCTA Show Series year. All Rider/Horse teams with Qualifying scores have an opportunity to ride for a Series Championship Award at their Level within their Division at this show.
 - A. Dressage
 - B. Combined Training
 - C. Western Dressage
- Year End Awards: Awards are given out at the Annual Banquet to recognize the year of achievements. Awards are given out for Rider/Horse teams for each Level and Division.
 - A. Dressage
 - B. Combined Training
 - C. Western Dressage
- Horse of the Year: Awards given out at the Annual Banquet for the horse with the highest average of three tests from two different judges (Scores from AA Handler, Rider Tests, and Freestyles with multiple riders are excluded).
- Breed High Point Awards: High Point Awards are awards given out at the Annual Banquet as provided by Breed Clubs, Associations, or sponsored by individuals.
 - A. Breed Awards (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
- Rider Recognition Awards: Are Awards given out at the Annual Banquet recognizing Rider achievement in their Division.
 - A. Open Rider (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
 - B. AA Rider (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
 - C. Jr/YR rider (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
 - D. JR14 (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
 - E. Vintage (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
- 70% Club: An Award given out at the Annual Banquet recognizing exceptional performance. This Award requires one score at 70.000% or higher from the highest test of the level.
- Rookie of the Year: An Award given out at the Annual Banquet recognizing exceptional performance of a first year IaDCTA member. Must be a first year member with IaDCTA, and have the highest average % of qualifying scores for a given Rider/Horse Team.
- Volunteer Award: An Award given out at the Annual Banquet recognizing the IaDCTA member with the highest hours logged by a single member (gifted hours subtract from individual total).


- Qualified Rider Award Medals: An Award given out at the Annual Banquet to recognize Rider Achievement at their level.
