The monthly board meeting of the lowa Dressage and Combined Training Association was held during the annual year end awards banquet on January 10, 2016. Meeting was called to order at 2:28 p.m.

Board members present were: Danielle Baker, Barb Zukowski, Nena Denman, Tammy Lisi, Sharon Malmberg, PJ Koehler, and Katie Barrowcliff. Those not present were: Chris Gutierrez and Michelle Corwin.

Motion to approve the agenda for the meeting was made by Danielle and seconded by Sharon.

Motion to approve the minutes from the previous meeting was made by Sharon and seconded by Danielle.

Motion to approve December's treasurer's report was made by PJ and seconded by Danielle. An amendment will be made to the Classics statement as charges for the EMT were entered twice.

Nena volunteered to get the club's trailer and take it in for needed repairs.

Nena reported on the Classics. The show will be on hiatus for 2016, with the dates being held for 2017. The club is looking for communication from the members as to what they want for a recognized show.

The Road to the Championships calendar will be coming soon. The club will have one or two laDCTA managed schooling shows. The rest of the schooling shows in the series will be recognized by laDCTA, if they have paid the recognition fees. Tammy has been in contact with the lowa Arabian Horse Association about sharing a facility for a weekend. We would possibly have a schooling show on one day and they would hold their rated Arabian show on the other day. This would allow us to split the cost of the facility. Dates are being held in March at the Ellsworth Equestrian Center and in May at the lowa Equestrian Center. We are also hoping to gain some input from the eventers on how they want championships done for eventing.

Sharon reported on the club's membership. In answer to some questions about where the membership fees go, she stated that \$20 goes to USDF for the GMO, and the rest of the money is used for clinics and shows. Money from the horse nomination fees, silent auction, and donations is used for awards.

Feedback is being asked for how the year end awards were tracked for 2015. The awards committee is looking at possibly separating the schooling and recognized awards. Three scores of at least 58% from two different shows would be still required for each series. To ensure each horse/rider gets the correct scores, please use the same name for each horse and rider on the nomination form as well as your show entries. Also, if riders want to receive any breed awards, they need to write the breed and registration number on the nomination form. This is also the same for Thoroughbreds that are part of TIP.

We are needing ideas of what clinics members would like us to offer.

The Dolly Hannon clinic is April 2-3, 2016 at Emery Training Center in Dexter, IA. She is offering private or semi-private lessons in both Western Dressage and Classical Dressage. Dolly is also inviting the rider's instructor/trainer to be in the ring while she teaches and learn how to help their rider.

Barb reported on the USDF Convention. Some of the important points include:

- Region 4 is currently in rebuilding mode with the election of Ann Sushko as director.
- The USDF is redirecting their marketing towards new educational platforms.
- There are new requirements for Equine Influenza Virus (EIV) and Equine Herpes Virus (EHV) vaccines. Horses without these vaccinations may be asked to leave the show grounds.
- Discussion was made about possibly rescinding the use of double bridles at Third Level.
- The National Dressage Finals is at the Kentucky Horse Park for 2016 and then will be in California in 2017. A debate is being held on whether to keep the Finals at the Horse Park in future years or look for another facility.
- Any questions can be sent to the USDF.

Deb Johnson, Katherine Wilson, and Sarah Arnold were elected as new board of director members. The 2016 executive board was elected as: Barb Zukowski, President; Tammy Lisi, Vice-President; Katie Barrowcliff, Secretary; and Deb Johnson, Treasurer. They will be joined by current members: Sharon Malmberg, Danielle Baker, and Michelle Corwin.

Miracles in Motion was voted as the 2016 beneficiary.

Meeting adjourned at 3:15 p.m.

New USEF Ruling on Equine Influenza & EHV-1

HOW IT WORKS AND WHAT TO DO

WHAT TO KNOW:



DOCUMENT OF RECENT VACCINES REQUIRED

Horses entering the grounds for Federation-licensed competitions must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus (EIV) and Equine Herpesvirus (EHV) (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within 6 months prior to entering the stables.



NO DOCUMENT?

Horses without appropriate documentation may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.

WHAT TO PROVIDE:



DOCUMENTATION OF THE VACCINATION

You must provide a record of vaccination with specific information about the vaccines administrated in the past 6 months, including:

✓ Vaccine Name

☑ Vaccine Route Mode

☑ Vaccine Batch

✓ Veterinarian

You can also use the USEF Vaccination Record which is available for download on the USEF website.

VACCINES ADMINISTERED BY A NON-VETERINARIAN

If you or someone other than a veterinarian administers the vaccine, you must provide a receipt of vaccine purchase that is signed by the owner or agent in care, custody and control of the horse. Information required includes vaccine name, serial number, expiration date and date of administration.*





EASE-OF-USE STICKER

The information required for the Vaccination Record is easily available on the package stickers which accompany FLUVAC INNOVATOR $^{\$}$.

Simply ask your veterinarian to place the sticker on your USEF Vaccination Record and sign.

Competition Management may not amend or enhance USEF vaccination requirements without prior approval of the USEF Veterinary Committee.

^{*} The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

- Designated hours will be posted at the show office for use of the warm-up area (indoor and outdoor) and show arena. There will be no riding on the show grounds prior to or after the posted designated times.
- ALL riders and/or their parents are required to execute a waiver in a form acceptable to IaDCTA.
- NO Children are allowed in the warm-up area that are not entered in the show.
 Competing children in the warm-up area must be accompanied by their parent (or designated responsible adult).
- NO Jumping of horses in the warm-up (or on a show course) except during designated posted times and anyone in violation of this rule will be eliminated from the completion with no refund of any fees. Horse not entered in jumping or Prix Caprilli classes may not utilize jumps at any time.
- Show is open to any interested individual.
- Volunteer hours will be available.
- For safety reasons, all riders are required to wear an ASTM approved safety helmet with fastened harness when mounted.
- Ribbons are awarded to 6 places. See above for classes that will be placed as one division.
- A horse/rider combo may only enter two consecutive levels. Horses also may only enter two consecutive levels if ridden by different riders. Horses ridden by two riders



Hot and Cold by Camie Stockhausen

I am on a TED talks kick. 'TED' stands for Technology, Entertainment and Design, and their byline is "Ideas Worth Spreading." Love TED.

The latest TED talk that reminded me of horses is a talk by Amy Cuddy about how your body language shapes who you are. During the talk, she is describing the design of their experiment. The subjects are to go to a job interview, but before they do, they are to be in a power pose or a non power pose for two minutes before the interviewers have been trained to withhold giving any body language back to the interviewees and only speak to them as they must. She remarked that "People hate this!" and I thought, "Horses do too."

And now for a break to look at a really pretty horse and William Fox Pitt, a magnificent rider: I made this graphic for another application so it has a few things that are not quite on point, but maybe not a complete bore either. But the point I want you to take from this is that WFP is giving the horse genuine positive feedback.



Now back to horses and feedback. Horses are in a funny position. Even the clumsiest among them can run faster than the fastest among us. Many of them can jump higher than we are tall. Yet, we come along, overconfident athletically untalented bipeds that we are and commence to boss them about in a language they don't initially understand, and doing so in some cases, in a manner that is too quick and too presumptive. Horses, half of the time, are just trying to figure out what in the heck it is we want from them. The main string they have to play on, being powerful beings of flight, is the one string that most people who ride them don't want them to play on, ever.

So people ride horses and try to communicate what they want the horses to do, but for the most part, riders default to communicating what they do not want the horse to do. "Now Trigger, don't buck, don't rear, don't shy, don't go to fast, don't be barn or buddy sour" and on and on.

It becomes like the old game of Hot and Cold where a group of people is trying to get a player to find an object that the group knows, but the player doesn't. If the group is required to only direct the person with negative directions, like saying 'Cold' when the player is not near the object, but not every using Warm and Hot for correct moves, the player has to keep stumbling in the metaphorical dark and it takes a very long time for the player to find the object. If however, the group can use, Warm and Hot to indicate when the player is moving in the right direction or nearly being successful, the game goes a lot more quickly, and, incidentally, is more fun for all.

That situation is like a rider training a horse. If the rider only uses Cold training, punishing the missteps and ignoring the correct ones, it takes a very long time for the horse to understand what is desired, and it isn't much fun for either party as the horse stumbles about in the metaphorical dark. But if the rider (who is always training, for better or worse) can use Warm and Hot training, such as "rewarding the try" and giving frequent praise for correct work, the learning curve becomes exponential, and incidentally, is more fun for all.

This video is a case in point. This is me on a four year old OTTB named Merida, sometimes called Monkey for good reason, going over her first cross rail. She wobbles on the approach, but gets over the fence just fine. I praise her immediately. I don't wait several strides to praise her. I don't wait until she does it perfectly to praise her. I don't stop her to praise her. We keep going forward and I let her know that what she did was good. In immediately taking the pressure off her by praising her, she starts to think this jumping thing is something she is good at. Whether she will be or she won't be a good jumper is dependent somewhat on her physical talent, but whether she will try with her whole heart is dependent on the response she gets from her rider. What we are really doing when we train horses is influencing their minds and growing their confidence. The physical follows.

Now what if Merida had run out and avoided jumping the fence? What does a thinking rider do? I think they make no comment to the horse, make sure that their own riding is correct, and simply re-present to the fence. Why? Because giving *no feedback is punishment*. Subtle punishment, but just like the above example in the experiment with the job applicants getting no feedback from the interviewers, giving no feedback is very uncomfortable. For a green horse who lacks jumping confidence, the No Comment response is negative enough. For many horses at many times, the No Comment response is negative enough.* Using No Comment for unwanted behavior and praising even wobbly attempts is analogous to playing the Hot and Cold game only using Warm and Hot cues. It goes much faster and is the most fun for everyone.

This way of training, of praising the try and allowing the incorrect to pass, is the opposite of what many riders naturally do: over-react to the mis-steps and under-react to the tentative, wobbly tries. The quickest and most positive way to train horses is to ignore minor mistakes, but immediately retry; and to notice and reward the *effort* rather than only the complete success.

^{*} For dangerous behavior, very clear negative response of short duration is needed. But most of the time, horses are trying to cooperate.

2015 IaDCTA Awards

The IaDCTA Awards program is designed to recognize achievement of those riders who consistently earn good scores and advance their riding level, and encourages a high standard of horsemanship in Dressage, Combined Training, and Western Dressage at IaDCTA-approved shows.

Guidelines for All Awards

- Only Scores from IaDCTA Recognized Dressage, Combined Training, and Western Dressage Shows will be counted towards IaDCTA Awards.
- 2. Rider of the horse must be an IaDCTA member at the time qualifying scores are earned.
- 3. Each Horse must be registered at the time qualifying scores are earned.
- A Rider may only qualify to win at two consecutive levels on the same horse, but Riders may qualify as many Horses as they wish.
- If Riders share a Horse, the Horse will be limited to four rides per day at two consecutive levels, and only one Horse and Rider combination per level or class.
- A protective ASTM approved hard hat with chin harness must be worn when mounted regardless of rider's age or level of competency.
- 7. A Rider is not allowed to enter more than 1 division. (i.e., cannot enter Open and AA.)
 Definitions of Rider Divisions:
 - A. Adult Amateur (AA): for Dressage, competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22 (USEF rules GR101).
 - B. Open division is for professionals as described by USEF rules GR1306.
 - C. Young Riders (JR/YR) are 21 and under.
 - D. Junior 14 (JR14) are 14 years and under.
 - E. Vintage (VIN) are 50 years and over.
- 8. Dressage and Western Dressage Competitors must obtain at three scores of 58.000% or greater from at least two different Judges to count towards IaDCTA Awards. Combined Training Results will be submitted as a placing for the class and awarded points towards a minimum point total to qualify for IaDCTA Awards.
- Complete one type of service per Rider. Volunteer hours can only be earned by laDCTA members, and gifted to other laDCTA members.
 - A. Complete 7 hours of volunteer time at laDCTA Recognized events.
 - Recruit 4 new members to IaDCTA.
 - C. Donate \$200.00 cash to IaDCTA.
- The IaDCTA Show Series Year runs from January 1st to October 31st. (2014 Championship Schooling Show results counts towards 2015 awards.)
- Championship rides (IaDCTA, Regional, or other Championships) do not count towards
 IaDCTA Awards.

IaDCTA Awards

- IaDCTA Championship Show: The final show of the IaDCTA Show Series year. All Rider/Horse teams with Qualifying scores have an opportunity to ride for a Series Championship Award at their Level within their Division at this show.
 - A. Dressage
 - B. Combined Training
 - C. Western Dressage
- Year End Awards: Awards are given out at the Annual Banquet to recognize the year of achievements. Awards are given out for Rider/Horse teams for each Level and Division.
 - A. Dressage
 - B. Combined Training
 - C. Western Dressage
- Horse of the Year: Awards given out at the Annual Banquet for the horse with the highest average of three tests from two different judges (Scores from AA Handler, Rider Tests, and Freestyles with multiple riders are excluded).
- Breed High Point Awards: High Point Awards are awards given out at the Annual Banquet as provided by Breed Clubs, Associations, or sponsored by individuals.
 - A. Breed Awards (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
- Rider Recognition Awards: Are Awards given out at the Annual Banquet recognizing Rider achievement in their Division.
 - A. Open Rider (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
 - B. AA Rider (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
 - C. Jr/YR rider (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
 - D. JR14 (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
 - E. Vintage (Highest average % of qualifying scores)
- 70% Club: An Award given out at the Annual Banquet recognizing exceptional performance. This Award requires one score at 70.000% or higher from the highest test of the level.
- Rookie of the Year: An Award given out at the Annual Banquet recognizing exceptional
 performance of a first year IaDCTA member. Must be a first year member with IaDCTA,
 and have the highest average % of qualifying scores for a given Rider/Horse Team.
- Volunteer Award: An Award given out at the Annual Banquet recognizing the IaDCTA member with the highest hours logged by a single member (gifted hours subtract from individual total).

- Qualified Rider Award Medals: An Award given out at the Annual Banquet to recognize Rider Achievement at their level.
 - A. May be earned over one or more years of competition.
 - B. Scores may be earned on one or more horses.
 - C. After receiving the Gold at a given level, the rider cannot earn another medal at that level
 - D. The Rider Awards program is effective January 1, 1998 and is not retroactive.


